FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BUTLER, PENNSYLVANIA This evening's service is framed around the reading and singing of the "O Antiphons." These medieval refrains, already used in the eighth century, invoke the Messiah under a different title derived from the Old Testament. This title is then amplified and followed by an appeal to "come" and save us in a particular way. Around the twelfth century, they were collected into a Latin verse hymn, which was later translated by John Mason Neale, finally becoming the beloved Advent hymn "O come, O come, Emmanuel."
